

PE and Sports Premium for Primary Schools

What is the PE and Sports Premium?

The government provides additional funding for maintained schools and academies to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport. Each school will receive £16,000 plus an extra £10 per pupil in Years 1 - 6.

At Evington Valley Primary School, we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of the children. We believe that an innovative, varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our children.

Detailed Information of Sports Premium

A. We appointed a full time specialist PE apprentice to develop and add to the PE and sport activities we already offer and make improvements that will benefit our pupils now and those who join our school in the future.

The role of the specialist PE apprentice is to develop an outstanding provision of PE and sport for all children by:

- Developing, with teachers, a whole school curriculum plan that inspires **all** pupils to want to be active and ensures full coverage of the national curriculum;
- Developing, with teachers, a whole school curriculum plan that has clear progression and success criteria that enables pupils to make more than expected progress and when appropriate achieve and exceed age-related expectations;
- Regularly reviewing the PE and sport provision and evaluating the impact in order to continuously improve the provision and ensure the inclusion of all;
- Introducing new sports and activities within lessons and as part of the extracurricular provision to encourage more pupils to take up sport, including the least active;
- Delivering, with teachers, high quality PE lessons throughout the day, at lunchtime and after school;
- Planning and leading specific sports events, such as 'Fitness and Fundraising Day', in our school;
- Liaising with local schools and the Leicester and Leicestershire school partnership to maximise opportunities for pupils to take part in a range of competitions;

To ensure the improvements are self-sustaining the specialist PE teacher will:

1. Lead high quality PE sessions in curriculum time alongside the class teacher to further develop their understanding and expertise in PE;
2. Develop the confidence and skill of other adults within the school to lead extracurricular activities, e.g. Y2 Football League;
3. Work alongside the staff members responsible for teaching swimming to develop their understanding and skills to deliver high quality sessions;
4. To provide a further opportunity for swimming lessons weekly for children in Year 4.
5. Support the PE subject leaders to evaluate and monitor the provision and use this information to continuously improve the provision we offer.

B. Membership of Leicester City School Sport and Physical Activity Network membership

- Enables us to play in at least 16 events or competitions with other schools;
- Provides us with support to develop our Sports Leaders;
- Gives us access to Change4Life resources;
- Gives us access to community club initiatives;
